Happy New Year, and welcome to 2012. Our team hit the ground running early last week and we are already seeing an increase in our client activity. Two client visits within the first week gives us hope for a great first quarter.

It was a big second quarter for the team in terms of consultant and client travel. Kimberly travelled to New York to represent Lexington as part of our Advantage Kentucky efforts aka, the Golden Triangle partnership. The team met with 10 consultants and hosted more than 20 consultants to a dinner event. Tyrone road-tripped to Atlanta to attend the Kentucky United consultant event and met with over 15 consultants. Last but certainly not least, and arguably the most important, Tyrone, Kimberly and Kevin Atkins journeyed up to Detroit to visit with key clients and the headquarters of several of our existing businesses. Good feedback at all events!

The calendar year ended on a good note for us, with the announcement of A & W Restaurant's New Global Headquarters choosing to "come back home" to Lexington. A ribbon cutting announcement will be coming soon. The new headquarters will employ 30 people. Unemployment levels continue to drop slowly. November numbers showed we were at 6.7%; this is a ½ a percent point lower than our last reporting. This tends to be a seasonal dip, and we'll wait to see what January holds for us.

We are hard at work on our budget request for 2013 and are greatly appreciative of all the support you have provided during this current year. On behalf of the entire Commerce Lexington Board of Directors and the staff of our economic development division, we again want to personally thank you for your continued financial support towards our economic development efforts. Thank you again for support of the team.

As required by the purchase of service agreement, we are providing our quarterly metrics, which outline our activities. The BBDP team has just completed our reports for the second quarter. Included is:

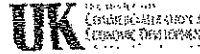

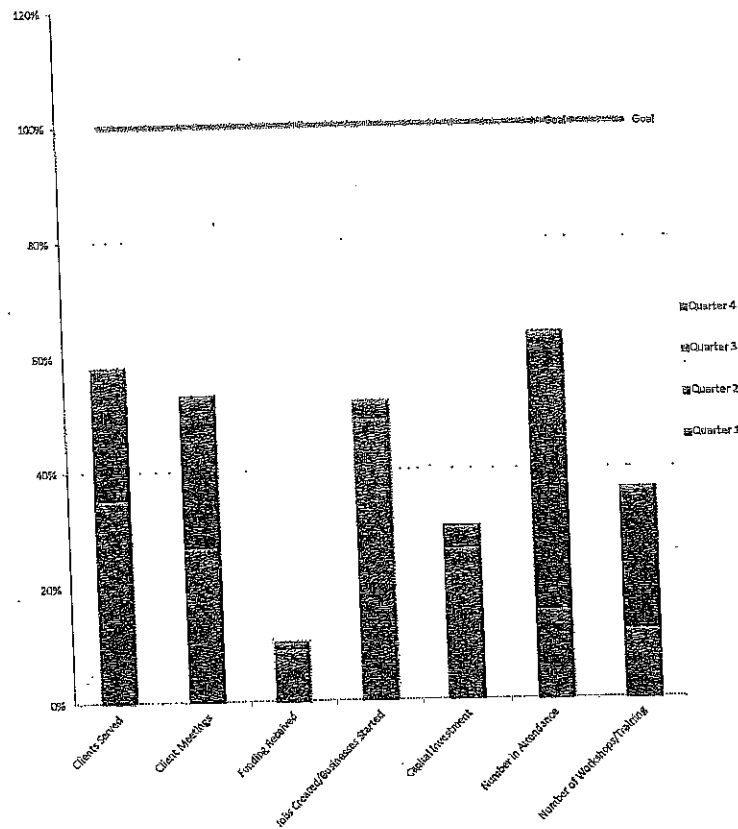

Commerce Lexington's economic development team actively recruits companies (manufacturing, distribution, headquarters, call centers) to expand or relocate to the Bluegrass region. Recruitment is achieved through many marketing initiatives such as advertising, direct mail pieces, tradeshows, site selection and corporate real estate consultant visits.

Commerce Lexington visits 150 export based existing companies every year. During the visits, the team identifies and addresses barriers to growth of existing firms, as well as work to retain the at risk companies. We also provide access to capital, opportunities and networks for businesses.

Commerce Lexington continues to work hand-in-hand with UK's Innovation and Commercialization Center and the Small Business Development Center on high-tech entrepreneurial projects. With these relationships, Commerce Lexington can provide access to information and funding for start-up companies. The partnership is also developing a resource website for entrepreneurs. To further support entrepreneurial companies, Commerce Lexington sponsors the SBIR/STTR conferences, as well as the Lexington Venture Club.

Total number of meetings with all clients, including multiple visit from recruitment projects and additional existing business visits needed.

Commerce Lexington works with the Kentucky Cabinet for Economic Development (KCED) in administering tax incentive programs, which are based on job creation and capital investment, to help companies offset their start-up costs. Traditional incentives awarded including KRI, KRA, KRIK and DCI are calculated in this number. Although not included, Commerce Lexington also helps coordinate with the KCED training program, such as grant-in-aid, and deed loan programs, which offer companies low interest rates.

Founded in 2002, The Lexington Venture Club is a partnership between Commerce Lexington and UK's Von Alden Center for Entrepreneurship. The Lexington Venture Club is a catalyst by which entrepreneurs, service providers, and investors work together to develop a strong economy in Central Kentucky. At the beginning of each year, we have our annual "Who Got the Money" reception which recognizes early stage and growing companies in Central Kentucky that have received funding through venture capital, angel investors, friends and family, and state and federal sources.

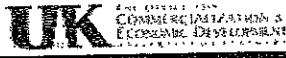

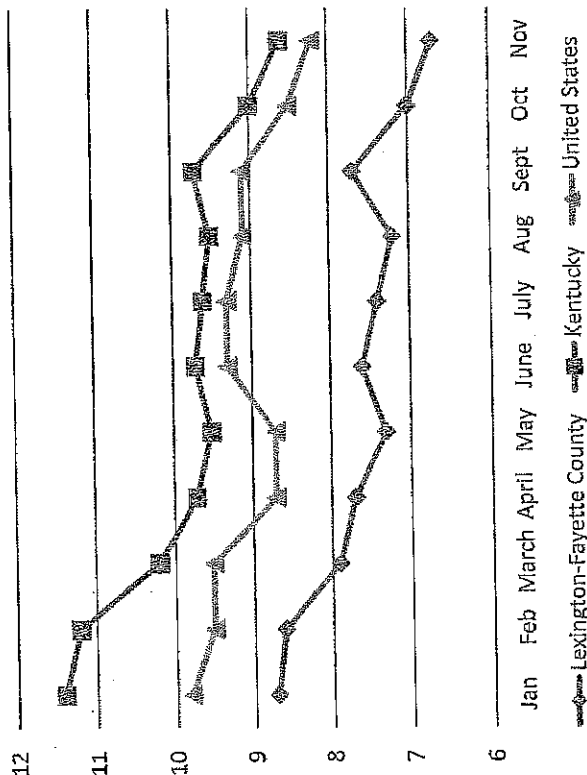
