Commander Thomas Curtsinger, Div. of Police, presented a police disciplinary recommendation regarding Detective Mark Evans:

It is alleged that Detective Evans committed the offense of Unsatisfactory Performance in violation of KRS 95.450 and General Order 1973-02/I, Section 1.11 in that on December 3, 2015, Detective Evans applied for and was granted a no knock search warrant for a residence on Lappin Lane in relation to a narcotics investigation. Detective Evans was given the responsibility to confirm the approach to the residence that was going to be used based on the video surveillance on the front of the house being utilized by the suspect. Detective Evans did not satisfactorily confirm this route which resulted in detectives entering a residence at 3165 Cottontail Lane instead of the residence on Lappin Lane. The unintended house was similar in style to that of the intended target; however Detective Evans failed to realize that they were a block away from the intended target. The recommended punishment is Eighty (80) Hours Suspension Without Pay and Retraining on Search Warrant Preparation and Legal Requirements.

Commander Curtsinger presented a police disciplinary recommendation regarding Officer Robert M. Lange:

It is alleged that Officer Lange committed the offense of Courtesy in violation of KRS 95.450 and General Order 1973-2/I, Appendix B, Operations Rules, Section 1.07 in that on February 15, 2016, Officer Lange was off duty at approximately 1630 hours and responded to the Manager's Office at 3751 Appian Way (The Metropolitan Apartments) regarding a complaint about a subject, later identified as Mr. Adam Wells, being disorderly and refusing to leave. During his interaction, Officer Lange identified himself as a Lexington Police Officer and Mr. Wells was asked to leave. Ultimately, Officer Lange had to escort Mr. Wells out of the office. Prior to escorting Mr. Wells out of the office, Mr. Wells lurched forward in an aggressive manner and Officer Lange responded by putting his hand up to stop Mr. Wells's advancement. However, during this encounter, Officer Lange used a profanity which was directed at Mr. Wells. The recommended discipline is a Written Reprimand.

Commander Curtsinger presented a police disciplinary recommendation regarding Officer Donovan Grider:

It is alleged that Officer Grider committed the offense of At Fault Collisions in violation of KRS 95.450 and General Order 1973-02/I, Section 1.40, in that on various days in 2015 and 2016 Officer Grider has been involved in three vehicle collisions during the past 12 months in which he was determined to be at fault. (1) June 29, 2015 – Officer Grider was parked on the right side of the roadway, approximately four car lengths from an intersection, when an emergency Signal 7 was broadcast. He placed his vehicle in reverse, looked over his shoulder while reversing, and thought he was in the intersection. As he reversed to the left, he misjudged the distance and hit a stop sign with the left rear bumper. (2) January 5, 2016, Officer Grider was parallel parked to

the right side of a drive lane in a marked parking space. There was a vehicle parked and unoccupied in front of him and, as he pulled out to his left, the front passenger side bumper of the cruiser struck the bumper of the parked vehicle. There was minor damage of scuff marks on both vehicles where they made contact. (3) February 8, 2016, Officer Grider was driving east on Loudon Ave. with his emergency equipment activated on his way to a Priority One call. As he approached the intersection of N. Limestone, he slowed and proceeded through the red light and saw another motorist who had a green light coming towards him from his right side. That vehicle, while braking, slid and was unable to stop, colliding with Officer Grider's vehicle. Officer Donovan Grider has not operated his Department-issued vehicle in a manner so as not to be at fault in collisions, resulting in three at-fault collisions within a twelve-month period. The recommended discipline is a Written Reprimand and Eighty (80) Hours Home Fleet Suspension.

Upon motion by Mr. Farmer, and seconded by Ms. Akers, the disciplinary recommendation was approved by unanimous vote.

Commander Curtsinger presented a police disciplinary recommendation regarding Detective McKenzie Willoughby:

It is alleged that Detective McKenzie Willoughby has committed the offense of At Fault Collisions in violation of KRS 95.450 and General Order 1973-02/I, Section 1.40 in that on various days in 2015 and 2016, Detective Willoughby has been involved in three vehicle collisions during the past 12 months in which he was determined to be at fault. The details of the collision are listed below: (1) April 23, 2015, Detective Bowles backed out of his parking spot at the Lexington Police Firearms Training Facility and came to a stop in front of Detective Willoughby's parked police vehicle. As Detective Bowles was stopped, his issued police vehicle was struck by Officer Willoughby's vehicle. Detective Willoughby did not observe Detective Bowles back out and he failed to look up before pulling out of his spot after his attention was diverted momentarily. (2) July 22, 2015, Detective Willoughby was on a traffic stop near 785 N. Broadway (Subway) when the suspects fled on foot from the traffic stop. Detective Willoughby was observed exiting his cruiser; however, his vehicle rolled into another car after he exited. The witness who

observed the incident advised when she observed this, she exited her vehicle and noticed Detective Willoughby's issued police cruiser was not in park. The witness placed the cruiser into park and stood by until other responding officers arrived. (3) March 9, 2016, Detective Willoughby was travelling behind Sgt. Truex on N. Broadway in the area of Haggard Lane; both were operating their issued police vehicle. There was heavy traffic at the time and Detective Willoughby did not notice Sgt. Truex slowing because he was reaching for his portable radio. As a result of reaching for the radio, Detective Willoughby rear-ended Sgt. Truex's vehicle. Detective Willoughby has not operated his department-issued vehicle in a manner to avoid at-fault collisions and as a result, he has been involved in three at-fault collisions within a year. The recommended discipline is a Written Reprimand and Eighty (80) Hours Home Fleet Suspension.

Upon motion by Ms. Lamb, and seconded by Ms. Bledsoe, the disciplinary recommendation was approved by unanimous vote.

Chief Kristin Chilton, Div. of Fire and Emergency Services, presented a disciplinary recommendation regarding Firefighter Johnathan Taylor.

It is alleged that Firefighter Taylor committed the offense of AWOL, 1st offense, a violation of UDG 1.11 as supported by POL 100.09 and in violation of KRS 95.450 in that, on February 10, 2016 he committed the offenses outlined in IA Case 2016-AWOL-0003, reviewed by the Fire Chief on February 16, 2016. The recommended discipline is a Written Reprimand.

Upon motion by Ms. Akers, and seconded by Mr. Farmer, the disciplinary recommendation was approved by unanimous vote.
