Breckinridge statues, located at 215 and 251 West Main Street, respectively, in Lexington, Ky., to an appropriate location and requesting that the Mayor present a recommendation to the Council concerning the appropriate location within thirty (30) days of the passage of this Resolution, was on the docket for first reading.

Upon motion by Mr. Gibbs, seconded by Ms. Mossotti, and approved by unanimous vote, the Council agreed to hear public comment on this resolution at the beginning of the meeting.

Before the commencement of public comments regarding the proposed resolution, Mayor Gray spoke about the proposed resolution, Lexington's history and events going on across the nation.

The appropriate punishment for this conduct is Written Reprimand.
