Lexington, Kentucky December 7, 2017

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on December 7, 2017 at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Gray in the chair presiding, and the following members of the council: Mossotti, Plomin, Smith, Stinnett, Bledsoe, F. Brown, J. Brown, Farmer, Gibbs, Henson, Kay, Lamb, and Moloney. Absent was Council Member Evans.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 170-2017 and 171-2017, and Resolutions No. 714-2017 through 732-2017, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky December 7, 2017

The Invocation was given by the Reverend Dr. Mark Johnson of Central Baptist Church.

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Mayor Gray asked Chief Mark Barnard, Div. of Police, to join him at the podium, along with Chief Barnard's family.

On the occasion of his retirement after a 31-year career, Mayor Gray spoke about the community's support for Chief Barnard and his Department. Mayor Gray played a video featuring community leaders talking about their positive interactions with the Chief and his officers, citing specific examples and policies that have improved their lives.

Acting Chief Ron Compton personally thanked Chief Barnard for his many contributions and his fine example to the Department.

The Council Members applauded Chief Barnard's leadership, his contributions to the community, his caring professionalism, and his regard for and positive impact on his officers and the City at large.

Chief Barnard thanked the Mayor and Council for their sentiments and expressed his gratitude to the officers and staff at the Div. of Police for their work with citizens in the community. He asked that citizens share with officers the appreciation that they have shared with him for their work well done. Finally, he thanked all of Lexington for their support.

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Mayor Gray asked the leaders and scouts of Cub Scout Pack 93 to join him at the podium. Mayor Gray talked about their volunteer activities and he read a Proclamation declaring December 7, 2017 as Cub Scout Pack 93 Day in Lexington.

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Mayor Gray asked Mr. J. Brown, Ms. Laura Gallaher, and the members of Common Good to join him at the podium. Mayor Gray described the value of the work of

Common Good and read a Proclamation declaring December 7, 2017 as Common Good Day in Lexington.

Mr. J. Brown described the work of Common Good, and Ms. Laura Gallaher expanded on that, talking about how a specific project, a futsal court, furthers the organization’s aim of developing leadership skills in young people. Mr. Ivan Nkinzo described the Futsal sport, and Mr. Eddie Irumva talked about how the futsal court has benefited the neighborhood and contributed to a sense of community in the area.

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Mayor Gray asked Ms. Heather Dieffenbach and Ms. Susan Benton to join him at the podium. Ms. Benton talked about the work of the Urban Libraries Council to further the interests of local public libraries, and the importance of libraries to the community. Ms. Dieffenbach spoke about the Top Innovator Award received by the Lexington Public Library in connection with its hosting of On the Table events. She also talked about the goals of the library and about the library hosting more On the Table events in 2018, to further the goals of creating access to information and creating welcoming public spaces.

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute Change Order No. 2 to the Contract with Fuelband, LLC, for the Ky. Theater Renovation Project, decreasing the contract price by the sum of \$1,740.92 from \$232,616.00 to \$230,875.08.

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute the 2018 General Term Orders for the Fayette County Clerk and the Fayette County Sheriff, establishing the number of deputies and assistants allowed to each and their respective compensation, subject to the limits for each category as specified in the General Term Orders and the requirements established by law.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute a Rental Agreement with the Lexington Center Corporation, for the 2018 MLK Day Celebration, at a cost not to exceed \$9,000.

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Mr. Bernard McCarthy, Harry St., talked about impact fees and community growth. He also commended the Div. of Police.

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Upon motion by Mr. Stinnett, seconded by Ms. Evans, and approved by majority vote (Ms. Mossotti and Mr. Gibbs were absent for the vote), the meeting adjourned at 7:46 p.m.
