

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky October 9, 2025

Officer Cervasio has also been issued multiple Coaching and Counseling Letters for incidents that have not reached the level of professionalism expected by supervisors and LPD policies since February 2025.

The appropriate punishment for this conduct is Four (4) week suspension (160) hours Without Pay.
